



But let's not fool ourselves into thinking that God only calls some of his children to have a heart for the four corners of the world; that the Great Commission only applies to pastors and missionaries. Whether you are a missions, Bible, or theology major or you're seeking to serve in the marketplace, in the public space of law and advocacy, in vocational ministry, or even in the home and in your family, your greatest joy will be as you give yourself to God's mission in the world that every tribe, tongue, and nation will be counted among his people.

B.A. in Christian Worldview and Apologetics

The Christian Worldview and Apologetics program is designed for students who are planning a ministry in apologetics or who are considering advanced study in philosophy.

B.S. in Biblical Studies: Global Studies

The purpose of the Global Studies program is to prepare you to live and work interculturally in both national and international settings. After completing this degree, you will be able to work in a variety of positions throughout the world in business, government service, relief and development organizations, and serve in traditional mission settings and churches.

on philosophy and loving your neighbor

Bryan Baise questioned his faith until he read C.S. Lewis' *Mere Christianity*, when he said that his faith came alive and made sense. Liberal college professors had challenged his belief in the Bible,

and he needed a voice of wisdom to bolster his confidence in the truth.

“I knew this [Christianity] was real, I knew this was true, but I didn't know why and I wasn't comfortable

saying that, just leaving it there,” said Baise, Boyce College philosophy and apologetics professor.

Baise graduated from the University of Kentucky, which he says helped him to “crystallize” his love for both philosophy and the gospel. He was one of the only theists in many of his classes, which helped him dig deeper into Scripture and learn how it fills the gaps in secular philosophy.

“The further I dug, the deeper the bedrock of my faith felt,” he said. “Studying philosophy actually ended up being just a study of further confirming what I already knew to be true but didn’t know how to explain it.”

Now, as the director of the worldview and apologetics degree at Boyce, Baise says he hopes his teaching reflects a commitment to loving God and loving neighbor. Through every course he

teaches, Baise wants to train students to study doctrines they may not agree with in order to love their neighbor well. The study of secular ideas, he said, makes Christians better ambassadors of the gospel. When students study Plato or David Hume, when they study the ideas that “swirl around in our culture” and are contrary to Scripture, it teaches students to love their neighbors as themselves, he said.

MARKETPLACE

Marketplace degrees equip you with a biblical worldview as well as the specialized knowledge and skills necessary for missionally-focused vocations.

B.S. in Teacher Education

The Teacher Education program at Boyce College will equip you with the specialized knowledge, insight, and skills foundational for an effective ministry through teacher education at home and abroad. With a high placement rate, you can serve as a teacher in the private school system or in the foreign mission field. You will find Boyce's Teacher Education program to be the ideal place to receive professional teacher training.

B.S. in Humanities

The Humanities program is designed for students who want a comprehensive education in humanities combined with biblical and ministry related courses. It is intended to help you prepare for a variety of occupations, including church and parachurch ministries, or further graduate studies, through a reflective engagement with history, literature, and philosophy.

B.S. in Business Administration

Whether you see yourself working administratively in a church or ministry, being a kingdom entrepreneur domestically or internationally, or ministering as you work in a traditional business, the Business Administration program provides you with a degree in business as well as a solid biblical and theological education that you can use to minister in unique places and contexts.

B.S. in Philosophy, Politics, and Economics

The PPE program is an interdisciplinary approach to studying influential ideas spanning from ancient to present day. It prepares you to successfully engage with concepts and beliefs that have shaped the world, whether in ministry, public life, or law.

The Worldview Studies Certificate at Boyce College is a one-year program that builds biblical foundations for university-bound high school graduates like you.







FINANCIAL AID

Boyce College offers affordable tuition rates for an incredible educational experience. The Financial Aid Office is committed to making education affordable.

Boyce Scholarships

Scholarships are awarded annually to qualifying students. Students may apply for one of the following scholarships:

- **General Scholarship:** Awards range up to \$1,000 per semester (\$2,000 per year) and are based upon demonstrated financial need.
- **Academic Excellence Scholarship:** Awards based on high school academic achievement and an essay competition. The scholarship is awarded for the first two semesters of study in the amount of \$2,000 per semester (\$4,000 per year).
- **MK Grant:** Children of current full-time IMB or NAMB missionaries who are enrolled in undergraduate programs may be eligible to receive a 100 percent tuition grant prior to the age of 30. College Board PROFILE not required. Visit boycecollege.com/missionsgrants for application and more information.

Eligibility Requirements

- Students must be enrolled at full-time status (12+ credit hours).
- Students must take courses at the Louisville campus.
- Students must be admitted into a degree program and be in good academic standing.

Spouse and Children's Grant Program

Spouses or dependents of full-time students may be eligible for a 50 percent tuition grant. Qualifying students must apply midway through the semester by submitting the Spouse/Dependent Form to the Accounting Office.
